What is the Municipal Emergency Services Authority of Lancaster County?

- Municipal-led administrative services authority
- Created to fund, manage and provide EMS services to member municipalities
- The local solution to our local EMS crisis

What EMS Crisis?

- EMS agencies locally and across Pennsylvania are struggling to maintain services. Why?
 - Funding shortfalls
 - Soaring costs
 - Staffing challenges



Local Example: Northwest EMS

- Widely known for outstanding service; Named EMS Agency of the Year in 2020 by PA Emergency Health Services Council
- But... facing insolvency:
 - Insurance reimbursement doesn't cover full cost of 911 emergency service calls and readiness for service
 - Less than 50% of residents contribute as subscribers
 - Increasing costs (equipment, fuel, training, benefits)



Municipalities Needed a Bold Long-Term Solution

- Municipalities are required by state law to provide EMS and were at a crossroads with services at risk
- A committee formed to study the feasibility of solutions in 2021 and identified the authority model as best path forward
- Public meetings held over several months
- Municipalities incorporated MESA February 2023



MESA: A New Community Model for EMS Services

- Locally and publicly owned and managed
- Controlled by local municipalities, not by hospital systems
- Dedicated 911 emergency service with 24/7 readiness
- Equitable, sustainable funding
- Full benefits for one mandatory fee
- Accessible leadership and public meetings
- Community has a voice



Benefits for All Residents of Member Municipalities

- 24/7 readiness to answer the call
- No residual bills for 911 emergency services if insurance pays
- 50% off 911 emergency ambulance bill if you have no insurance or if entire payment goes toward your deductible

All benefits provided for a single annual fee.



Will I Have to Pay the Annual Fee If I Have Insurance?

- Yes; Insurance reimbursements only occur on a per call basis and cover roughly half of the total cost of service
- Insurance does not cover cost of readiness for service
- Mandatory annual fee will fund balance of operational expenses, ensuring readiness for service and fiscal stability



Will MESA Replace Northwest EMS?

- Yes, MESA will be the new entity providing EMS services to member municipalities
- Will consist of the same outstanding people and deliver the same outstanding service for which NWEMS is known

New entity, new name... same NWEMS people and services!



How will MESA work?

- Board of representatives from each founding municipality
- As a public government entity, board meetings are advertised and open to the public
- Instead of generating revenue through voluntary municipal contributions and subscriptions (as NWEMS does today), MESA will charge a mandatory annual fee to property owners
- Insurance reimbursement remains part of revenue model




2024 Estimated Budget: \$5.6 million

- MESA Board established in consultation with a local CPA firm
- Based on NWEMS historical data and future projections
- Revenue includes projected insurance reimbursements and annual fees from property owners, businesses, organizations and institutions in member municipalities



Business

With 8 FTEs (full-time equivalent)

> \$10 x 8 = \$80 annual fee

Fee is Authorized under Municipality Authorities Act

- The municipalities that incorporated MESA elected to fulfill their obligation to ensure the provision of EMS services by way of the Authority
- MESA was formed under Pennsylvania Municipality Authorities Act (Act 53 Pa.C.S. § 5601 - § 5623) and approved by the Commonwealth on February 7, 2023



What's Next?

- NWEMS continues to provide EMS services in Northwest Lancaster County until MESA begins operating
- MESA plans to begin operating in early 2024
